BACKGROUND

I have been invited to speak on a panel at the Madras workshop on Thursday, August 29. Other panelists include Joseph Franell, General Manager and CEO Eastern Oregon Telecom; and Lynn Ewing, Mayor, City of Maupin, Oregon.

The board is welcome to attend the workshop if interested and available.

DISCUSSION

We'll gather at the front of the room at 10:20 a.m. (ten minutes before the restart after the morning break). Steve Corbato (Executive Director Link Oregon / Oregon Fiber Partnership) will make very short opening remarks to frame the session and to introduce the three panelists. Eight minutes will be allocated to each panelist to make initial remarks, including any slides (no questions at that point). The presentation order will be Lynn first, then Nick, and finally Joe.

They have asked us to discuss our individual stories – particularly overcoming initial challenges, approaches to external funding and consultants, and achieving sustainability – which they feel will be very important for the audience to hear. We expect that we will touch on the potential role of electric coops and community anchor institutions as well.

BACKGROUND

We reviewed Blue Mountain Telecom's bid and after researching with the company we identified that their bid did not include prevailing wage rates. As a result, Quanta Telecom was the low-bidder on the City Hall build.

DISCUSSION

Our original bid deadline for this solicitation was in March 2019. The quote form provided to the vendors includes, in pertinent part, that the contractor agrees that all applicable provisions of Oregon law relating to public contracts (ORS Chapter 279A, 279B & 279C) and the City's public contracting rules are, by this reference, incorporated in and made a part of the Quote. This form further provides that the contractor hereby states that the contractor agrees to comply with the provisions of ORS 279C.838, 279C.840 or 40 U.S.C. 3141 to 3148, as applicable.

Unfortunately, many of the contractors were either unfamiliar with these requirements or did not research them in enough detail to determine that any bid over \$50,000 would require prevailing wage rates. In the future, we will include a statement in the advertisement and RFQ along the lines of "the project is a public works project subject to the provisions of ORS 279C.838, 279C.840 or 40 U.S.C. 3141 to 3148, as applicable."

RESULTS

The price-ranked city hall bids were as follows:

Pro-UG - \$60,995.00 - not prevailing wage/did not re-bid Quanta - \$64,427.00 Blue Mountain - \$69,743.21 Texstar - \$69,800.00

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend we issue a notice of intent to award to Quanta and authorize me to sign the professional services agreement for this build.
